



# A GLANCE AT CELTIC COLOURS **2018** WITH Artistic Director Dawn Beaton

Pjila'si! Fàilte! Bienvenue! Welcome! I am so glad you're joining us for Celtic Colours, whether this is your first time or one of many. For those of you who crossed the Causeway to be here, I hope you felt what so many Cape Bretoners do when you finally arrived at that green swing bridge welcoming you home.

That physical link between Cape Breton and the mainland is symbolic of the theme for this year's Festival: "Connected". As you explore the Island you'll see many communities that pull their name from an t-seann dùthaich or the old country, a direct connection to our Scottish settlers; and those that have maintained their original Mi'kmaw names. Maintaining connections is one of the reasons we as Capers stay on this Island or visit home frequently. This special place beckons us all to return home to our family and friends, to relive fond memories and create new ones.

We are all connected in some way, whether through place, music, family and relationships, or shared history and experiences. It is these connections we'll explore through the line-up of performers chosen and special projects that foster kinship among artists.

We'll also embark on the next phase of the Maple Project this year that will see 22,107

maple trees planted across the Island, one tree for every ticket sold in 2017. Working with community groups, partners, and individuals, the planting of these beautiful maples will bring people together and connect us further to this special land.

While we'll be planting many trees, we'll also harvest a few for a special project titled Voices of the Naomhóg. Boat builders and musicians from Ireland will connect with local artists, who will learn the art of constructing these boats. Together they will learn tunes and songs from both sides of the Atlantic to be presented during the Festival. After the first performance in Baddeck the artists will row these boats on the Bras d'Or Lake to the second concert in Iona. Be sure to check out this unique show and see the naomhóg for yourself!

For this year's tribute shows, we'll pay homage to a man from Scotland whose influence on the Island's piping tradition lives to this day, and a couple who, while they have never visited Scotland, have made an impact on the music, and the revitalization of the step dance culture that is growing there. The Pipers' Ceilidh will be a nod to Sandy Boyd, and our Close to the Floor show will celebrate Minnie and Alex MacMaster.

And what would our Festival be without our esteemed Artists in Residence? Allan MacDonald and Paul MacDonald have been working hard to help shape this year's Festival and each will present a special show of the bardic and song traditions in the Gaelic language. Be sure to check out Bards of Boisdale and Òrain: The Connecting Thread.

My gracious thanks for being a part of Celtic Colours, to our Cape Bretoners who share their gifts and open their hearts, and to our many visitors for traveling the lengths you have to join us for this annual celebration.

# CELTIC COLOURS COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Celtic Colours recognizes the importance of keeping traditions alive. Beyond the nine-day festival, time and effort is placed on creating opportunities to present traditional cultures, from here and elsewhere, to the community at large.


#### THE JOHN ALLAN CAMERON BURSARY

With songs in Gaelic and English; tunes touching on the Scottish, Irish, Cape Breton, Finnish, Swedish, and Norwegian folk traditions; fiddles, pipes, whistles and guitars; and steps that will leave you breathless, this matinee may put to the test the popular aphorism that music is "the universal language". It's safe to say that most will have no trouble understanding beloved Cape Breton singer-songwriter Cyril MacPhee's heartfelt lyrics or the rich delivery of his songs. The tradition of descriptive and satirical Gaelic poetry and song dates back to Ireland's Iron Age, continued well into the 18th century in Scotland and extended into the early 20th century in Cape Breton. Among the communities on the Island where this style of composing flourished were Barrachois, Boisdale and Beaver Cove. Through years of preservation efforts, documenting and compiling these songs from the area, a collection was created known as the The Bards of Boisdale that reflects the characters, culture and everyday events of the late 19th century Boisdale district. Tonight we'll hear a few songs from the collection sung by Scotland's Cathy Ann, Rona, Kathleen, Allan and Mairi and Cape Breton's own Sarah MacInnis. Inspired by Irish musician Breanndán Ó Beaglaoich's 2017 journey from Ireland to Spain in a traditional Irish rowboat, Voices of the Naomhóg will see this group of artists teaming up to build and row their own naomhóg from Baddeck to Iona. While the boats are being built, with the assistance of Mi'kmaq craftsmen, the artists will create new music, Gaelic song, and dance to be presented at concerts in Baddeck and Iona. In the early 1970s, a television documentary was broadcast on CBC that delivered an alarming message. The Vanishing Cape Breton Fiddler suggested that the Cape Breton fiddle tradition was in such a state of decline that it could soon disappear altogether. This shocked a certain population of Cape Bretoners into action and a group of citizens dedicated themselves to making sure this would never happen. Regular meetings led to the idea of presenting some kind of fiddle festival. And in 1973, the first Festival of Cape Breton Fiddling attracted thousands of people to Glendale for a concert featuring more than 130 players. Preparation for this concert led to the formation of the Cape Breton Fiddlers' Association. They have been at the forefront of a resurgence in Cape Breton fiddling that has seen the tradition and style flourish at home and around the world.
